Professional Development Workshop report from Michael Tevenan

I was introduced to eTwinning in 2013 when I joined St. Brigid's Primary School in Kildare Town. I began a project where my 5th class students became pen pals with students from Chalette-sur-Loing, France. In September 2014



I continued my involvement through attending a Professional Development Workshop (PDW) in Tallin, Estonia, on “Integrating Computer Programming into the Primary Curriculum”.

I had no prior knowledge of the Estonian curriculum but based on the information provided leading up to the PDW I made the assumption that IT/Coding was a specific subject in Estonian Primary Schools...I was wrong. Although children in pre-school/kindergarten are directly taught how to code, that is where it stops. In primary school, the teachers make a conscious effort to integrate IT/Coding into each lesson—the use of technology is a methodology in their curriculum, just as in ours.

I got direct experience of using new technology myself through mini-workshops at the PDW on ‘Developing apps for Android phones’ and ‘Sploder’ (a tool for making online games)—neither of which I had any experience of. To our surprise these workshops were delivered by teenagers (adult facilitators were there to assist), which really

highlighted to me that adults do not need to be able to use the technology, merely facilitate its use. However it was very satisfying to present what we'd learned to all 122 delegates the next day, when I teamed up with ten others to adapt the popular phone app ‘4 Pics 1 Word’ for educational use.

From the PDW I learned that you do not need to be able to use every kind of technology, nor should you fear being unable to answer a student's questions. Your students will support each other and they will educate you. There are of course challenges in integrating technology into our teaching, acquiring the necessary equipment/software and staying up-to-date. But through developing a support network such as eTwinning, we can collaboratively advance our teaching and use the technology available to assist our students in gaining a competitive advantage in the world jobs market.

Ceardlann Forbartha Gairmiúla - Tuairisc le Michael Tevenan

Cuireadh in aithne do eTwinning mé in éascóirí), rud thug chun suntais dom nach 2013, tráth a thosaigh mé ag obair i mBunscoil Naomh Bhríd (St. Brigit's) i mBaile Chill Dara. Chuireas tús le tionscadail ina ndearna daltaí rang a cúig i mo scoil cairde pinn le daltaí ó Chalette-sur-Loing sa Fhrainc. I mí Mheán Fómhair 2014 lean mé orm ag gabháil d' eTwinning. D'fhreastail mé ar Cheardlann Forbartha Gairmiúla i dTallin na hEastóine faoi “Ríomhchlárú Ríomhaire a chomhtháthú sa Churaclam Bunscoile”.



Ní raibh aon réamheolas agam ar churaclam na hEastóine ach de réir na faisnéise a cuireadh ar fáil roimh an gCeardlann mheas mé gur ábhar ar leith é TF/Códú i mBunscoileanna san Eastóin....ní raibh an ceart agam. Cé go múintear códú go díreach do pháistí réamhscoile/naíonra ní dhéantar é a thuilleadh ina dhiaidh sin. Sa bhunscoil déanann na múinteoirí iarracht d'aon ghnó chun TF/Códú a chomhtháthú i ngach ceacht—is modheolaíocht ina gcuraclam—san í úsáid na teicneolaíochta leis, díreach mar atá againn sa bhaile.

Fuair mé taithí dhíreach ar úsáid a bhaint as teicneolaíocht nua i mioncheardlana ag an gCeardlann Forbartha Gairmiúla ar ‘Aipeanna d’fhóin Android a fhorbairt’ agus ‘Sploder’ (uirlis chun cluichí ar líne a dhéanamh). B’ábhar ionadh dúinn gur déagóirí a reáchtáil na ceardlanna (bhí daoine fásta i láthair chun cabhrú mar

gá do dhaoine fásta a bheith in ann an teicneolaíocht a úsáid ach amháin go mbeidh ar a gcumas a húsáid a éascú. B’ábhar sásaimh dúinn é áfach, na rudaí a bhí foghlamtha againn a chur i láthair don 122 toscaire an lá dá gcionn, nuair a chuireamar le chéile le deichniúr eile chun an aip fóin móréilimh ‘4 Pics 1 Word’ a chur in oiriúint d’úsáid oideachais.

D’fhoghlaim mé on gCeardlann Forbartha Gairmiúla nach gá a bheith ar do chumas gach saghas teicneolaíochta a úsáid, agus ní gá eagla a bheith ort roimh cheisteanna na ndaltaí. Tacóidh na daltaí lena chéile agus cuirfidh siad oideachas ortsa. Cinnte, bíonn dúshlán ann maidir leis an teicneolaíocht a chomhtháthú inár gcuid teagaisc, maidir leis an trealamh/ na bogearraí riachtanacha a fháil agus coinneáil bord ar bhord. Ach mar thoradh ar líonra tacaíochta cosúil le eTwinning a fhorbairt is féidir linn ár gcuid teagaisc a chur chun cinn i gcomhar lena chéile agus an teicneolaíocht atá ar fáil dúinn a úsáid chun cabhrú leis na daltaí buntáiste iomaíoch a bhaint amach i margadh post domhanda.
